Cathy Vincent, owner of Adandy Farm in Greenwood, Delaware, has been in the Arabian horse business since 1967, providing sales, training, breeding and marketing of the finest Arabian Horses in North America, always with an eye toward producing and training national champions.

Adandy Farm has produced dozens of National Champions in Open and Amateur, both in Performance and Halter.



Mark Jamieson is the owner and head trainer of Jamieson EquiCenter, Conyers, Georgia. Mark, born and raised in Washington, was influenced by his parents' passion for the Arabian horse, and began showing and training his parents' Arabian horses as a teenager. As a lifelong accomplished Arabian and half-Arabian trainer, Mark has garnered numerous U.S. and Canadian

National Championships and Top Tens, as well as Regional Championships and Top Fives for and by his clients. Most impressively, these significant awards cross over a variety of disciplines: English, country, western, hunter, costume, and show hack. Also, Mark has garnered championships in open competition, and has coached and encouraged wins for both his amateur owners and his junior riders. Mark's clients credit him with a strong work ethic, honest integrity, unwavering patience, and a wicked sense of humor. Mark not only has knowledge and talent, but also a true ability to evaluate and understand a horse's physical strengths and mental temperament to maximize each client's horse's full potential in the show ring. She competed as a member of the Hollins College Intercollegiate Horse Show Association team where she was ranked nationally, and then went on to a highly successful amateur and professional career with Dressage and Sport Horses in Arabian and USDF shows. As an amateur rider, she earned three Dover Amateur Medals at 2nd level and as a Dressage trainer, has garnered over 75 National & Regional Titles in Dressage, Sport Horse under Saddle, Sport Horse in Hand and Hunter Hack including being named USDF Horse of Year 2nd - 4th level and twice named

USEF All Breeds Horse of the Year. Robin is currently enrolled in the USEF Dressage judges program, is a United States Dressage Federation Bronze Medal recipient, and has successfully campaigned horses from Training level through Prix St. George at the FEI level.



Carolyn Duncan, Crooked Creek Farm, Woodstock, Georgia, has been training horses and riders in the Hunter/Jumper and Equitation for 10 years. She and her students have earned dozens of regional titles and multiple national titles including 3rd in the open jumpers in 2011. She has been a clinician for the youth jamboree seven of the last ten years. She also has served as a judge for several local hunter jumper shows for the last five years.

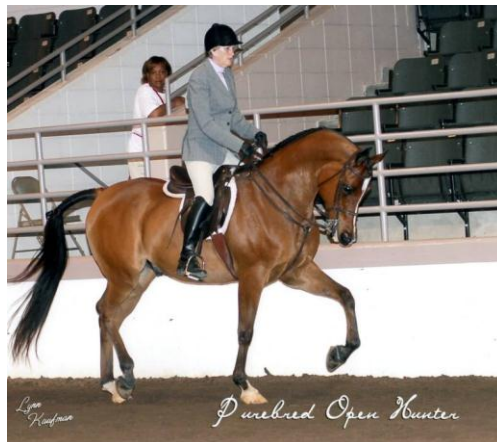
